Soror Nancy Golden began her Delta story when she was initiated into the Sorority in December 1977 at Cheyney University, Delta Tau chapter. She earned her Bachelor of Science degree in Special Education from Cheyney and her Master of Education degree in Educational Administration from Temple University. She was a dedicated educator for 32 years in the School District of Philadelphia, where she was a special education teacher, special education liaison, department chair, assistant principal and principal. She currently serves as Treasurer of the Sanctuary Fellowship Worship Center and Beacon House Ministries and volunteers in many community programs. In QCA she supports chapter programs and has assisted with voter registration, secured performers for Artist's Café, and has been a guest author for Toy Library. She is also listed in the *Delta Authors on Tour Directory 2018-2019 Volume IV*.

Soror Golden discovered her love of the Arts early in life, when she would perform and sing original songs with her sisters and friends. She still thoroughly enjoys acting and honed her theatrical skills at Weist Barren Television and Commercial Workshop, Villanova University, Philadelphia College of Performing Arts, Kathy Wickline Casting Agency in Philadelphia, and Mike Lemon Casting Agency in Philadelphia.

This talented soror has performed in various industrial films at Center City Video in Philadelphia, and has acted in a number of plays in and around the Philadelphia vicinity such as *A Street Car Named Desire*, *God's Trombones*, *Black Nativity*, *Seek Ye First* and *Smiling Faces*, just to name a few. She has written and staged two plays which were showcased at the Mandell Theater in Philadelphia. In September 2019, she was the assistant director of an original play entitled *For Your Eyes Only*, which was staged at the Proscenium Theater in Center City Philadelphia.

Soror Golden states that she presently utilizes her gifts to positively impact her sphere of influence. She has self-published three children's books and currently has a YouTube channel where she reads engaging stories, sings delightful songs and introduces rich vocabulary to early learners between the ages of 3-6.
